from The Principal ...

Kia Ora,

We have had another fantastic couple of weeks at Longbeach School and we ticked off a few significant events. Congratulations to all those who took part in our Cluster Swimmings Sports. Seeing all the swimmers in action was fabulous; all were doing exceptionally well. Several of our students then went onto the Counties Swimming event this week. And again, they swam very well, and a few of them placed and will go on to the Primary Swimming Championships.

Attendance

Going to school is critical for our children's futures. The evidence is clear that every day of school matters and missing school leads to lower achievement. In Aotearoa, New Zealand, learners are expected to attend school every day the school is open – yet many don't. Our attendance rates are falling and are worse than in other comparable countries. In 2022 New Zealand primary school regular attendance dropped to 42 per cent.

What do we mean by 'regular attendance'?

'Regular attendance' is when a learner misses less than a week of school a term.' Non-regular attendance' is when learners miss a week or more of school in a term. **A day here and there adds up to a lot.** Learners who miss **a week** of school each term will have missed out on **a year** of schooling by the time they are 16.

Longbeach School has two-thirds of students with regular attendance and one-third with non-regular attendance. And the primary reason for this is; students are absent because they are taking a day off or on holiday during school time.

We would like to see 90% of students attending regularly; present more than 90% of the time. This way, the students are given the best chance to achieve highly.

Anti-social behaviour

Recently we have experienced some unwanted attention. We have had to pick up broken glass, collect empty cans and bottles, repair signs and retrieve balls and cones. Longbeach School has been untroubled for a long time and is a place for everyone to enjoy. It is a shame a few people are choosing to spoil it for the majority. As a result, we have begun looking at installing security cameras. In the meantime, if you see someone acting inappropriately, please let us know.


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
