from the Principal...

Kia ora

Last Friday, we had the pleasure of running our annual Triathlon, and luckily, the weather played its part, as it was neither too hot nor too cold. Our students did very well as they ran, swam and biked around our courses. Seeing the students' support for each other was fabulous as they encouraged one another during this challenge. Also, we were well supported by our parent volunteers, who helped us run this event - so a HUGE thank you to all of you who supported us and made this event a success.

Our senior syndicate, Kahu, travelled to the EA Networks Centre this week to participate in our Southern Cluster Swimming Sports. This event is hotly contested between Mayfield, Mt Somers, Carew Peel Forest, Hinds and Longbeach Schools. It is a fantastic event as old friendships, and rivalries are reunited as the students put themselves through their paces in the pool.

You will no doubt be aware of changes in government policy around cell phones in schools and an hour a day for reading, writing and maths.

Cell Phones

We are reviewing our existing policy about cell phones in school to align it to the government's changes and ensure it is fit for purpose. Once our board completes this review process, we will send it to our parent community for consultation. The changes will be minor as we have been asking students to hand into the teacher cell phones brought to school for quite some time now. Our policy change will clarify our expectations and outline a process for misuse of cell phones.

An hour a day for reading, writing and maths

We are confident that we meet this requirement of an hour a day for reading, writing and maths. We have structured literacy and mathematics curriculums that are well-designed to meet the needs of our students. Our literacy programme is timetabled into specific areas of learning time throughout the day—specific structured literacy areas such as spelling, writing and reading. Our structured mathematics is usually timetabled from 12.15 pm to 1.15 pm daily. Then, in addition to the structured literacy and mathematics programmes, literacy and mathematics will be integrated into the other learning areas as appropriate. For example, in 'topic', students will be reading and writing about an area of learning, such as our local history or the adaptations of species in the animal world.

The new 'one hour a day' requirement has been designed to be practical and flexible. We can still hold events like athletics days and school camps since the requirement is for an average amount of time each week.



MT HUTT 2024 PASSES

We are excited to offer the Mt Hutt Local Schools Season Pass again for 2024!

As in previous years, the Local Schools Season Pass offers access to all NZSki mountains, including Coronet Peak, The Remarkables and Mt Hutt for the duration of the 2024 winter season.

Age permutations for adults remain at 16 years and up for our standard products. However, for local schools we are continuing to offer child rates to students who be aged 16-18 years of age as of the 1st of June 2024 if they are still in attendance at an eligible local school. The Local School Pass will be available to purchase until **Friday 31st May 2024**, after which point, the pass will not be available to purchase.

As per, upon the close of sale for the Local School Season Pass, we will be in touch with each school to confirm that the students we have noted as attending your school are registered with you. We very much appreciate your help and support on this to ensure that we can continue to provide discounted rate passes to local students.
