Kia ora

Last week, all of our students hopped on a bus and toured our community to experience local history. One of the highlights was the tour of the Longbeach Estate. Penny Thomas was a fantastic guide as she took the students through the historic parts of the estate (thank you, Penny). The students absolutely loved seeing all the old artefacts and getting a sense of what it was like in the 1800s. When we explored the old stables, we saw the room the stable worker lived in. Our students were fascinated by the fact he had left his boots behind when he left a hundred-plus years ago. Also, there was a lot of interest in the original field tiles that were used to drain the swamp land before it was turned into farmland. This trip was a great start to our topic, Aotearoa New Zealand Histories and this energy has been carried into our classroom teaching and learning programmes. Our students are now connecting the parts they learnt on their trip, delving deeper into the local history. Then they will use this information to create such things as timelines, maps, pamphlets, recipes (meals from back in the day), and historical stories. Also, it has been great to see and hear the teachers and students using the Depth & Complexity Framework to dig deeper into the local history by examining trends and patterns, changes over time, different perspectives and ethical decisions.

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Room Huntingdon...

In Room Huntington, we have been learning how to write an engaging procedure with a variety of language features. We made Toasted Sandwiches and used this experience to base our procedure on.

We also focused on the 'aim' element of procedures, and how these are used to hook in the reader to entice them to make/create/follow your procedure!

How to make a toasted sandwich

Do you like toast? Do you like cheese? Well have I got the snack for you! The Toastie, is not only delicious, but so easy to make that even a small child could do it *. Filled with delicious molten cheese, encased in a crunchy goldenbrown exterior, this snack is perfect if you are in need of a quick versatile snack. Follow these simple steps so that you too may indulge in the magnificence of the Toastie.

<u>Ingredients</u> Cheese Pre-sliced bread

Margarine or butter

<u>Equipment</u> Toastie Machine Butter knife Sharp knife (for cheese) Chopping board Napkin Electricity

- 1) Firstly, slowly plug the sandwich press into the power outlet. The sandwich press will start to heat up automatically.
- 2) Secondly, grab two pieces of bread out of the bag and deliberately lay them on the chopping board.
- 3) Next, slowly spread the butter on the faces of the bread with a butter knife. Once you've done this, flip the bread so the butter is facing down.
- 4) Next, grab a sharp knife and slice the cheese into thin slices. Gently place the cheese onto the unbuttered faces of the bread.


Room Huntingdon (Cont'd)...

- 5) Open the Toastie machine and carefully place one piece of bread with the butter side facing down, with the cheese on the unbuttered side. Place the other piece of bread on top of the cheese with the butter facing up.
- 6) Close the machine. Check your Toastie often. Once it is golden brown, turn the machine off. Cautiously take your Toastie out of the machine. Be careful, it will be hot!
- 7) Put your Toastie on a plate. Eat aggressively and enjoy!
