from the Principal...

Kia ora

We have had another fantastic couple of weeks at Longbeach School and have ticked off a few significant events. Congratulations to all those who took part in our Cluster Swimming Sports. Seeing all the swimmers in action was fabulous; all did exceptionally well. From this, several students qualified to attend the Counties Swimming event on Tuesday the 12th of March 2024.

Term 2 Sabbatical

I have been fortunate enough to be awarded a TeachNZ sabbatical for Term 2 and will be travelling to Canada to attend the ULead Conference and visit some schools in Calgary. I am looking forward to this experience as it is an excellent opportunity to learn about the Canadian schooling system and see what best practices we can adopt to improve our school. During my absence, Sarah Lovell will be the Acting Principal. This is an excellent opportunity for Sarah to take the helm and grow her leadership skills.

Attendance

Going to school is critical for our children's futures. The evidence is clear that every day of school matters, and missing school leads to lower achievement. In Aotearoa, New Zealand, learners are expected to attend school every day the school is open – yet many don't. Our attendance rates are falling and are worse than in other comparable countries. In 2022, the regular attendance at primary schools in New Zealand dropped to 42 per cent. The total for 2023 data is not available until April; however, in Term 2023, it was only 45%. So, the poor attendance trend seems to be continuing.

So far this year, Longbeach School has had 71% of students attending regularly, 90% plus of the time. The primary reason for students' absences is that they take a day off or are on holiday during school time.

We would like to see 90% of students attending regularly and present more than 90% of the time. This way, the students are given the best chance to achieve highly.

Attending 90% of the time still allows for five days of sickness or appointments each 50-school-day term, so there is plenty of scope to allow for illness or appointments.

We used a variety of materials to create our portrait art. This created a layered look in the completed pieces.


